Economic Development and factors affecting development	Autumn 1	Students will learn how globalisation and economic development affect countries around the world. Students will learn how to assess the strategies used to reduce inequalities in development. Students will use Kenya as a case study to understand how economic development is supporting a reduction in the development gap.	Practice exam answers using prior knowledge. Students will be challenged to link their understanding of development. Students will develop the coherence of their responses to exam-style questions. Students receive feedback to improve exam technique.
Changing Economic World UK	Autumn 2	Students will learn how the UK has become a post-industrial economy. Students will learn how a growth in tertiary sector industries has supported changes in rural and urban spaces in the UK. Students will prepare for their PPE examinations.	Students will access complex economic concepts of post-industrial investment in the UK. Students will develop their assessment of social and economic impacts alongside environmental impacts when investment in modern infrastructure occurs.
Resource Management	Spring 1	Students will learn how global resources are distributed and understand the challenge of finite natural resources. Students will learn a small scale and large-scale water schemes in order to assess the sustainability of this resource.	Students will complete an Issue Evaluation which requires students to effectively use secondary sources of information to evaluate a crucial resource. This is food, water or energy.
Fieldwork & Pre- Release	Spring 1	Students will recap and embed learning to support their understanding of fieldwork in Geography to support Paper 3. The AQA pre-release booklet will be shared, and students will be able to learn, discuss and assess the issues discussed in the Issue Evaluation module.	Students will be challenged to link their synoptic learning from coastal and human fieldwork to exam-style questions. Students will need to coherently understand and apply their knowledge to tackle large scale issues in the pre-release booklet.
Revision	Summer 1	Students will undertake a coherent revision programme to focus on Paper 1 and Paper 2 topics in AQA GCSE Geography prior to their summative assessments.	Students will refine their technique in practice exam answers using prior knowledge. Students will take part in examination ready sessions in order to recall and apply their
