Devising Development	Autumn Term	<p>Throughout the term students will practically explore a range of workshops that explore elements of performance.</p> <p>They will look at improvisation, characterisation, non verbal communication and mask as ways of developing and improving devised performance work.</p> <p>They will have an opportunity to recap how key practitioners create performance work whilst further developing their practical repertoire through the utilisation of key techniques.</p>	Students will explore more advanced performance styles and techniques, building on prior knowledge to extend their repertoire in preparation for Component 3.	

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Responding to a Brief	Spring Term	<p>Students will learn how to respond to a professional performance brief in a style suitable to the brief and stimulus provided by the exam board.</p> <p>Students will respond to stimuli through a range of short devised tasks allowing them to create a bank of ideas and styles to focus on. These will include direct audience address, episodic structures, narration, representational characters and choral and ensemble work.</p> <p>Students will learn to evaluate their performance response, identifying their approaches to devising and the skills used to create engaging theatre.</p> <p>Alongside this, students will re-evaluate successful use of characterisation, including pitch, tone, pace, projection, pause, silence, intonation and accent, and body language, gesture, facial expressions, gait, posture and proxemics.</p> <p>This unit is BTEC – Component 3 – Responding to a brief. It is worth 40% of the course.</p>	Students will receive ongoing coaching and feedback throughout their rehearsal process, with individual directorial guidance given to improve and develop performance.
