

# Attendance – A Look Ahead to September

As we come to the end of the school year, we want to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support and to reflect on the importance of regular school attendance.

## Did you know?

There is clear evidence that good school attendance is directly linked to better academic progress, emotional wellbeing, and long-term life outcomes. Learners attending over 95% (less than two weeks missed) are TWICE as likely to achieve a Grade 5 in English and Maths than learners attending 90% (four weeks missed). Below 90% attendance, the difference in achieving these grades is even more significant. In terms of later life, for those learners who are now aged 30, the earning gap is significant at around £30,000 - that is why attendance is so important in relation to life chances.

## Attendance Support

We are committed to supporting our students to ensure a positive start in the new academic year. Positive attendance from the beginning of term is a crucial step and we want to work together to address any challenges that may impact your child's ability to attend regularly.

In September, we will:

- Closely monitor attendance from the start of the year
- Offer appropriate support or intervention if there are concerns
- Celebrate and encourage positive attendance and improvements with you and your child.

If you feel there is anything that we should be aware of, please do not hesitate to contact us - your support is vital and we are here to support your child.

We wish you and your family a safe and relaxing summer break and we look forward to working in partnership with you to make a positive and successful return in the Autumn term.
