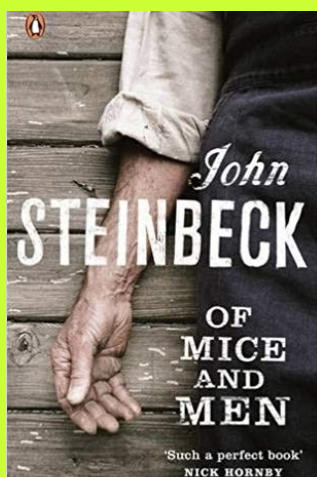

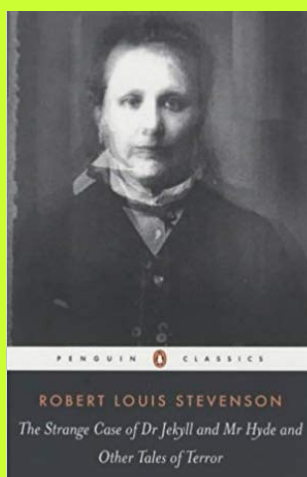


## OF MICE AND MEN

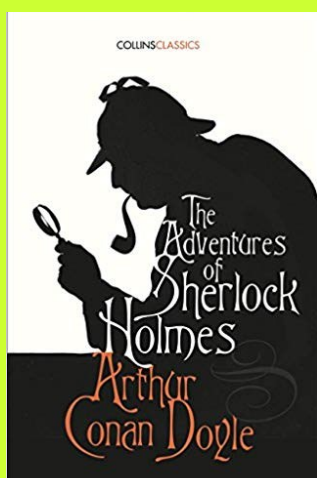


## THE STRANGE CASE OF DR JEKYLL AND MR HYDE

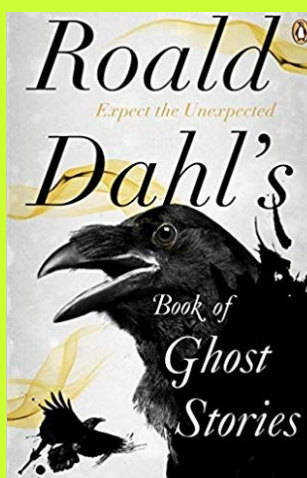

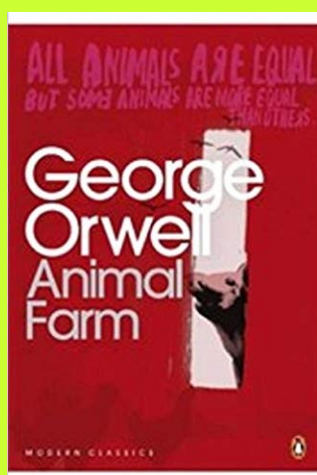

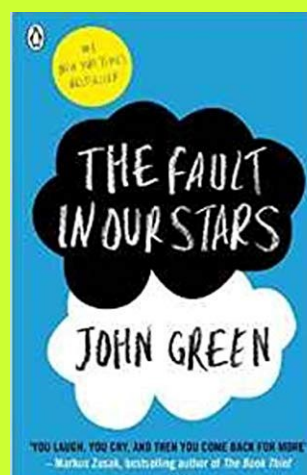


## ANIMAL FARM
