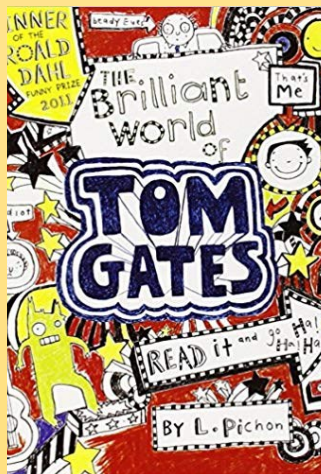

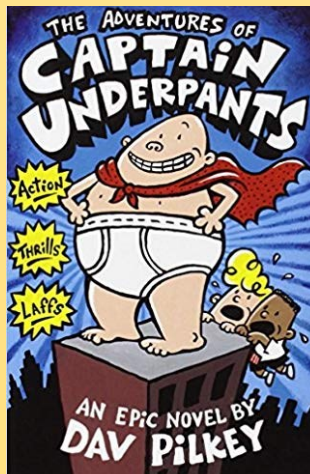


TOM GATES (series)

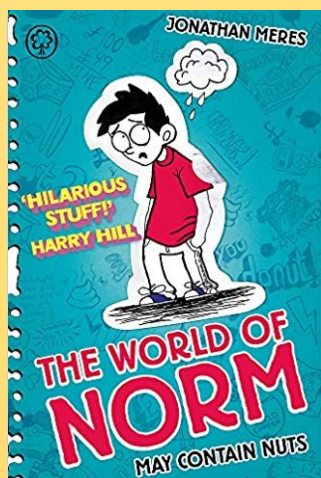


THE ADVENTURES OF CAPTAIN UNDERPANTS (series)

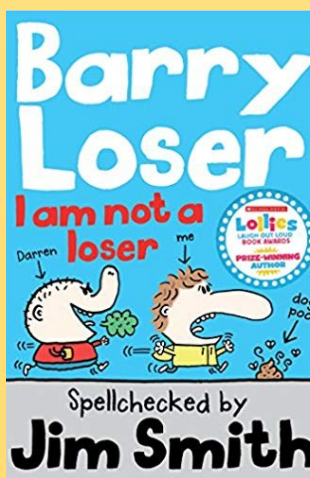


WORLD OF NORM (series)

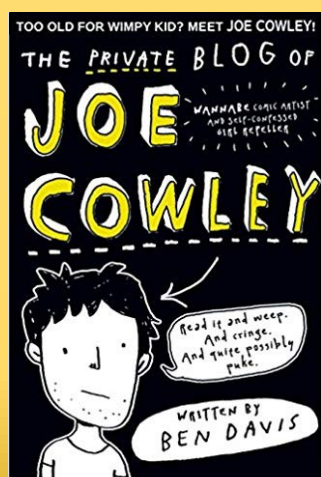

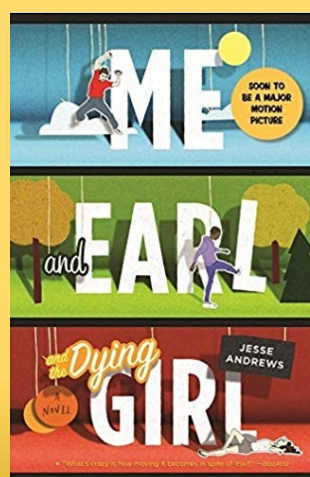
