<b>Year 7 (Class of 2026)</b>	<b>Vikings</b> - This is our pre-1000 study. We consider whether the Vikings were 'vicious' through looking at a range of case studies of Viking histories. We develop second-order concepts in each lesson to prepare our students for the year ahead. We complete a knowledge test at the end of this unit.							<b>Cornish History</b> - This is our local history study. We consider various case studies of Cornish history, including smuggling and Cornwall's role in WWI and WWII. We complete a knowledge and written test at the end of this unit.							<b>1000-1500</b> - We begin our chronological study of British and world History by completing a 'big picture' lesson of the period and then learning about the Norman Conquest. We complete a knowledge test at the end of this unit.							<b>1000-1500</b> - We now look at various events in this period, including Becket vs. Henry II, Magna Carta, Black Death, important women, African History and the Silk Roads. We complete a knowledge and written test at the end of this unit.							<b>1500-1750</b> - We start this new period with a 'big picture' lesson before learning about Tudor monarchs as well as life in towns and cities and the East India Company. We complete a knowledge test at the end of this unit.							<b>1500-1750</b> - We finish by studying the Stuarts, including Charles I, the Civil War, Interregnum and Restoration. We complete a knowledge and written test at the end of this unit.							CEW Week
<b>Year 8 (Class of 2025)</b>	<b>1750-1900</b> - We start this new period with a 'big picture' lesson before learning about the Industrial Revolution and also begin learning about the slave trade. We complete a knowledge test at the end of this unit.							<b>1750-1900</b> - We continue looking at the slave trade and then a case study on the British Empire. We complete a knowledge and written test at the end of this unit.							<b>1900-present</b> We start this new period with a 'big picture' lesson before looking at the First World War, including causes, key events and experiences. We complete a knowledge test at the end of this unit.							<b>1900-present</b> - We continue this period by focusing on the fight for women's suffrage, the interwar years and a case study of WWII. We complete a knowledge and written test at the end of this unit.							<b>1900-present</b> - We now focus on the Holocaust, followed by a study of rights in the 20th and 21st centuries. We complete a knowledge test at the end of this unit.							<b>1900-present</b> - We end the year with our world study, focusing on the Middle East, including the Arab-Israeli wars, the war on terror and the Arab Spring. <b>Year 9 (Class of 2024)</b>	<b>Apartheid</b> - We focus chronologically on the story of Apartheid in South Africa, considering its causes, progression and how it ended. We develop skills to support students in Paper 2.							<b>Apartheid and Migration</b> - We finish our study of Apartheid and then consider migration in Britain from 1000-present. We develop skills required in Paper 1. Students complete a knowledge and written test at the end of the Apartheid topic.							<b>Migration</b> - We complete our study of migration and then students complete a creative 'beautiful project' of their work. Students complete a knowledge and written test at the end of the topic.							<b>Paper 2: Early Elizabethan England</b> - We begin the GCSE course by studying Chapter 1 of EEE.							<b>Paper 2: Early Elizabethan England</b> - We now study Chapter 2 of EEE.							<b>Paper 2: Early Elizabethan England</b> - We begin the GCSE course by studying Chapter 1 of EEE.
