Fragments	Autumn Term	<p>Having already started their Fragments project during the summer term in year 10, students will start the autumn term in a strong position. They will have already developed a theme connected to Fragments that they are exploring and will have studied at least one photographer relating to this theme. The main focus of the first half term will be the refinement of ideas and techniques. This involves a process of taking a photoshoot, digitally or physically editing the images and reviewing the work before starting this cycle again, making the necessary improvements.</p> <p>In the second half term, students will work towards a final outcome for the project using the ideas and techniques they have refined previously. This final outcome will be produced in a 5 hour controlled assessment.</p>	<p>Independence and resilience are key skills in the students' final coursework project. They will be expected to drive their own photographic work and ideas based on the theme given and supported in tutorials with their teacher.</p> <p>The more independent and self-motivated a photography student is at this stage the better their work will become.</p> <p>This project is excellent preparation for students externally set assignment and the skills needed for further education.</p>	<p>History- historical contexts of work studied.</p> <p>Art- artists studied and art techniques applied to photographic images</p> <p>CLASS- Political, social &amp; personal contexts explored in the development of ideas.</p>

Students are expected to use the skills and experience that have gained through out the course to produce work based on the title given.</p> <p>Students are assessed on the same 4 assessment objectives that they work towards in their coursework units.
