Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has flown by with a number of highlights including half of our Year 9 History cohort enjoying the Bodmin Jail experience on Wednesday followed by all of Year 10 heading to the Hall for Cornwall yesterday to watch An Inspector Calls as part of their English GCSE curriculum.

The trip leaders reported back that the behaviour of our students on these trips was impeccable. The enthusiastic Bodmin Jail tour guides said that we were one of the best-behaved secondary schools they have ever showed around and, in Truro, there were numerous comments from members of the public regarding how well our students represented Penrice. We are delighted to hear that your children are representing Penrice with such pride when on field trips and the relevant Heads of Year will be thanking students for their exemplary behaviour in next week's assemblies.

Planned Strike on Wednesday 1st February

Yesterday, an electronic letter was sent out to all parents/carers regarding next week's strike action. The letter covers the reasons for the strike and the logistics we are putting in place for Wednesday.

The key logistical points are as follows:

- Due to the strike, the school will have significantly reduced staff resource/capacity. We are therefore unable to open as normal.
- With final GCSE exams on the horizon, Year 11 have been prioritised and are expected to attend school on Wednesday. Buses will run as normal. Lunch will be available for Year 11s in the canteen on the day.
- Years 7, 8, 9 & 10 are to stay at home and learn remotely. A full day of tasks and homework will be available on Satchel One, however this will not be in line with all students' timetables. All students are expected to complete the work set.
- We may also be able to offer supervision to children from financially vulnerable families and/ or critical workers. Please request a place by completing this form by 8.00am on Monday 30 January 2023. We will consider all requests based on our projected capacity but will only be able to offer a small number of limited places.

Thank you so much for your support. And please remember, if you need supervision for your child on the day of the strike, please complete the abovementioned <u>form</u> before Monday at 8.00am.



Awards are available for the best performers, including potential qualification for future national rounds of the competition. Good luck to all students involved!



Foodbank Vouchers & Local Support Event

At Penrice, we have an ongoing our relationship with the local foodbank. As part of this link, we now have access to the voucher scheme to access the foodbank. We would also like to draw your attention to the support they offer at the Foodbank. They run a drop-in on Thursdays where you can talk to the team. They offer support for a range of things including financial advice and mental health. Next week, on Thursday 2nd February, they will have the Citizens Advice there who will also be available to offer help on a drop-in basis.

Period Passes

In addition to last week's message regarding toilets, we are taking this opportunity to remind all female students about our available red card period passes via their tutors in the near future.

We understand that girls cannot always plan for the arrival of their periods which may take place during lessons. With this in mind, girls can request red period pass cards via their tutors which they can keep in their bags to use when required. This system has always proven successful, and many Penrice girls already know of and make use of the cards.

Crucially, this system operates on trust, and is monitored to ensure that the cards are used appropriately.
