












Students Take Part in National UKMT Maths Challenge

A select group of Year 9 and Year 10 students took part in the annual UKMT Maths Challenge on Thursday 2 February. This national competition is designed to make students think and encourage them to consider mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems.

This Maths Challenge is not like your standard GCSE paper. There are multiple choice answers which helps students, but on the flipside, students are penalised and deducted marks if they answer questions incorrectly! If a student is does not know an answer, they are advised to not simply guess. Awards are available for the best performers, including potential qualification for future rounds of the competition, so good luck to all students involved!

Mrs Taylor, Maths Teacher, said: "Participating in the national UKMT Maths Challenge is a great thing for students to mention on college/apprenticeship applications and in interviews. It is very impressive! Also, by taking part in the Junior or Intermediate Challenges, students will also be more likely to be selected to take part in the Higher-Level Challenge in Post-16 education."

After the test, Travis (Year 10), reflected and said: "It was quite a hard test, but I gave it my best. I took part in the UKMT Maths Challenge in previous years, so I had a good understanding of the format. I achieved a Silver Certificate in the Junior Challenge in Year 9. The format was very similar to the test in Year 9, but the questions on this Intermediate Challenge were much harder.

The entire Maths Department wish our Year 9s and 10s the best of luck as they await their results.
