Getting to Know Me Assemblies

I started this term by running 'Getting to Know Me' assemblies with each year group. This was a great opportunity to formally introduce myself to students, not just professionally, but on a personal level too. An Important Term Ahead for Year 11s

The Spring Term is crucial for our Year 11 students. There have already been key GCSE exams in Food, Hospitality & Catering and Child Development this week, with further exams in MFL starting next week.

Also this week, the Class of 2024 received their PPE results which has given them a real understanding of where they are at in terms of progress. All teachers at Penrice, including myself, have been promoting the concept that PPE results do not

define success; it is how students react that is important.

Hot off the back of the PPE results, we launch the first of our Exam Success Sessions (ESS) on Monday 22nd January between 3pm and 4.15pm. All Year 11 students have been given personalised timetables with a schedule of which afterschool sessions they can attend. On a final note regarding Year 11, I wish to thank all parents and carers who participated in the Year 11 Progress Evening this week. Partnership is essential at this stage and by working closely together we can provide the best support for your child to have successful outcomes.



Do I need to pay?
